

TRS has 428,000 active and retired members. The average pension was about \$41,703 last school year. 48 retirees receive \$200,000 plus highest are from Long Island. James Feltman: \$326,610 Retired superintendent Commack Union Free Schools. 56% worked 30 years or more 24% of the 164,000 school pensioners live outside NY State. Over the last 20 years the fund has grown \$65.2 billion to \$116 billion a 20 year annualized rate of return 7.2%.
